

From the Pastor's Desk

Feb 2025

"And he who was seated on the throne said, "Behold, I am making all things new.""
-Revelation 21:5a

I write this pastor page today while the Christmas decorations adorn the office, and the weight of too many Christmas cookies lay heavy in my tummy. In the background I have Christmas music playing, a mix of contemporary and Christian hymns. (Nothing

like getting a vision of "O Holy Night" followed by Ertha Kitt singing "Santa Baby") In just a few days the holiday lights will give way to the everyday pressures of life, and we will get back to our daily routines and activities. But I do hope you took some time over the Advent season to reflect on the gift of family and friends, and God's great love for you, that he would come to us as a child in lowly states, to be our Savior and Lord.

Every end of the year is a chance to reflect on what was, and an opportunity to dream and hope for the year to come. We know we will have a change in our nation's leadership and in a politically divided country like ours, there will be celebrations as well as hand-wringing at the prospects of a new administration or the fears of a new regime. Some of us will simply drop out of the discussion and hope for the best.

I woke up today at the news of violence breaking out in Nigeria, as members of the Global Methodist Church attacked United Methodist Church members, resulting in death and the destruction of homes. How can this be possible? Yes, there is a divide between our denominations, but we are still the children of a loving God who sent his Son as an atonement for our sins. I pray for the leadership in both denominations to admonish these acts and to set aside our divisions and work toward peaceful ecumenical mission in making disciples for the kingdom of God. (Note: some United Methodist acted in retaliation in the Nigerian region and have been condemned for their actions.)

The wars in the Ukraine as well as the middle east will most likely escalate before there is any progress toward a peaceful resolution. Tensions will remain between governments as cyber attacks escalate. And our borders will remain a hot topic of division between our political parties.

But I hold out hope. Sure, things may get worse, but they can also get better. I trust in a loving God that will intercede into the lives of those who place their trust in him. I have hope in a God who will come into the life of the addict and lead him/her into sobriety. I have hope in the God who can heal our sickness an pain. I have hope in the Lord who can open opportunities to find employment, and ways and his Kingdom. I have hope in the God who will one day, "make all things new."

Hold onto hope and trust in the love of Christ as we face another year together in the


